PIRSA – Family and Business (FaB) Support Program

South Australia's Family and Business (FaB) Support Program supports the health and wellbeing of communities in South Australia impacted by weather-related events.

Our team of experienced FaB support mentors are available to meet, listen and, connect individuals, farming families and regional businesses affected by seasonal conditions, such as drought or hailstorm events, to appropriate services and programs.

The FaB Support team provide an informal, confidential, independent and understanding contact - at no cost - and are based in or near the drought affected areas of South Australia.

On-Farm Emergency Water Rebate

The Australian and SA Governments are offering a rebate to drought affected farmers who invest in urgently-needed on-farm water infrastructure.

Eligible farmers can access a 25% rebate – up to \$25,000 – on new purchases and installation costs for on-farm water infrastructure to help them in the current drought and be better prepared for future dry conditions.

The On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate scheme can be applied to:

- new purchases and installation of: pipes, water storages, water pumps and/or de-silting of dams
- drilling of new stock water bores and associated infrastructure including: desalination plants and/or power supply such as generators.

Farmers will be eligible to apply through PIRSA for the rebates, which will also cover eligible work undertaken since 1 July 2018.

Red Cross Grants for Farming Communities

\$11 million is now available to help drought-affected farmers, farming families and farming dependent contractors. Red Cross has now partnered with CWA in South Australia to get the funds out through their aid programs.

Grants can help meet household expenses, such as food, vehicles maintenance, school expenses, electricity, gas or rates, telephone expenses and dental or medical expenses.

Australian Government - Drought Communities Programme

Provides Eligible Councils with up to \$1 million for local community infrastructure and other drought relief projects for communities impacted by drought.

The extension of the Drought Communities Programme provides funding of \$81 million in 2018-19 to Eligible Councils to deliver benefits to targeted drought-affected regions of Australia.

The program will support local community infrastructure and other drought relief projects for communities impacted by drought.

Australian Apprentice Wage Subsidy

From 1 January 2019, the Australian Apprentice Wage Subsidy will support apprenticeships in [skills need occupations](#) in rural and regional areas and encourage participation in apprenticeships by employers who have not previously engaged apprentices, as well as re-engaging employers who may have disengaged from the system.

The Australian Apprentice Wage Subsidy is available to employers who sign-up and commence a new worker Australian Apprentice from 1 January 2019 and until 1630 sign-ups have occurred.

The Australian Apprentice Wage Subsidy provides support in the first three years of an Australian Apprenticeship as follows:

- 75 per cent of the first year award wage;
- 50 per cent of the second year award wage;
- 25 per cent of the third year award wage.

Australian Govt - Maker Projects Stream B

Maker Projects aims to foster creativity and inquiry based learning in Australian schools and communities through the establishment of: STEM-related events and education activities delivered in partnership with industry for youth under 18 years of age. These will build capability and leverage off the skills gained by organisations who have previously participated in delivering innovation, entrepreneurship and enterprise focused education activities for young people (Stream B).

The objective of Maker Projects is to encourage practical skills, creativity and entrepreneurial thinking through the development of maker spaces and activities in schools and communities.

This is with the view to reaching as many students as possible, including those in regional and disadvantaged areas.

Emergency Management Volunteer Scholarships

The Australian Government has established a million-dollar scholarship fund to equip volunteers with the skills and leadership required in the emergency and disaster management sector. Volunteers may be eligible for financial support to access accredited vocational and higher education qualifications in emergency and disaster management fields.

The program initially consisted of four application rounds; in recognition of the program's demonstrated value, the Australian Government announced an additional \$1 million in funding in August 2018, and the addition of a fifth application round.

Information Linkages and Capacity Building – Economic Participation of People with Disability

The Australian Government is inviting applications in an open process to apply to deliver activities under the Community Inclusion and Capacity Development (CICD) Program – Economic Participation of People with Disability Grant Round from June 2019 to 2020.

Information, Linkages and Capacity Building (ILC) is funded under the Community Inclusion and Capacity Development (CICD) Program. The objective of the CICD Program is to build innovative ways to increase the independence, social, community and economic participation of people with disability.

The objective of this ILC Grant round is to improve the economic participation of people with disability across Australia. Applications must:

- Build the capacity of people with disability to be active in the economy, particularly through employment, and/or
- Support employers to enhance their knowledge and capabilities to employ people with disability.

Eligible grant activities could include:

- **Capacity Building for Employers** - build the capacity of workplaces to attract, employ and retain people with disability.
- **Pathways to Employment** – projects that build employable skills of people with disability in workplace settings.
- **Fostering Entrepreneurship** – projects that build capability for people with disability to develop and maintain successful self-employment.
- **Other** – other innovative projects to increase employment of people with disability.

In a Good Place – Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal

In a Good Place is a national grants program that provides support for community-driven initiatives that reduce social isolation, increase social participation and connectedness, and encourage people in rural, regional and remote communities who are at risk of, or are experiencing, mental health issues to seek help.

There are three objectives for this program:

- Reduce social isolation;
- Increase social participation and connectedness;
- Increase help-seeking.

By supporting local solutions and using a multi-faceted approach focused on enhancing people, place and wellbeing, our donor partner, CCI Giving, aims to give back to those overcoming challenges and adversity, and to the most marginalised in society.

The program comprises two open call grant rounds per annum, offering grants of up to \$20,000 from an annual funding pool of \$200,000. There is \$100,000 available in this funding round.

Light Regional Council's Sponsorship, Grants and Incentive Scheme Event Sponsorship Program

Grants are available of up to \$150 for state and interstate activities and up to \$300 for overseas activities for youth displaying considerable talent in cultural, sport and recreation, science, technology, arts and community service activities to enable them to participate in activities to further enhance their skills and talents. Young people aged between 12 and 18 residing in Light Regional Council are eligible to apply.

SA Heritage Grants Program

If you own a State Heritage Place or a place in a State Heritage Area and are planning a conservation project that will help conserve or protect significant fabric or heritage values, you may be eligible to receive a SA heritage grant.

Given the large number of conservation projects that may be eligible, other considerations may include projects that contribute to:

- the community - works with 'public good' component
- heritage tourism - works that will result in increased visitation of a place or area
- heritage trades and training - works that use traditional trades and skills and/or support specialised training
- adaptive reuse - conservation works that support compatible new uses or continued use of a Place
- places at risk - works to prevent further deterioration and conserve fabric at risk
- remote and very remote places - works that support the regions.

- have a minimum total membership base of 20 members. Total membership can include associate, social and life membership
- provide most recent certified or audited Statement of Financial Performance and / or Statement of Financial Position

Community Recreation and Sport Facilities Program

The Community Recreation and Sport Facilities Program helps eligible organisations to establish or improve sport and active recreation facilities that meet the needs of the community in South Australia.

To be eligible organisations must:

- Be a not-for-profit sport club, association or sports facility manager incorporated under the *Associations Incorporations Act 1985*; or
- Be a Council; or
- Be a School Council/Board of Management; and
- Be operating for 12 months or longer

Youngcare – Home Support Grant

Grants of up to \$20,000 are available for essential equipment, home modifications and services such as respite on in-home care, household items and utilities.

The grant also seeks to bridge the gap in essential services and support for families in need, during the transitional period while the NDIS is fully established.

Bite-Size Grants
