Australian Government - Drought Communities Programme

FLINDERS RANGES COUNCIL & DC OF PETERBOROUGH NOW INCLUDED

2019 Community Heritage Grants

The Community Heritage Grants (CHG) program provides grants of up to \$15,000 to community organisations such as libraries, archives, museums, genealogical and historical societies, multicultural and Indigenous groups.

The grants are provided to assist with the preservation of locally owned, but nationally significant collections of materials that are publicly accessible including artefacts, letters, diaries, maps, photographs, and audio visual material.

Veteran and Community Grants

The objective of the program is to maintain and improve the independence and quality of life for members of the Australian veteran community by providing funding for projects that sustain or enhance health and wellbeing.

The intended outcomes of the program are to:

- Deliver projects that are sustainable, financially viable and have an ongoing benefit for members of the Australian veteran community; and
- Deliver projects that increase opportunities for members of the Australian veteran community, associated with social activity and community participation and/or improve health behaviours and support healthy places

Bite-Size Grants

The Northern and Yorke NRM Board's Grants program provides funding to community groups and not-for-profit organisations to enable them to undertake projects that deliver positive environmental outcomes across the Northern and Yorke NRM Region.

A portion of the Community Grants budget has been allocated to the Bite-Size Grants program, to provide support for small, short-term projects ranging from \$200 - \$500.

This program is funded through the Northern and Yorke Natural Resources Management Board and particular NRM priorities must be met. Project funds must be acquitted and a completion report submitted within 3 months of receiving the grant money.

The Retailer Energy Efficiency Scheme (REES) is a South Australian Government energy efficiency scheme that provides incentives for South Australian households and businesses to save energy. It does this through establishing energy efficiency and audit targets to be met by electricity and gas retailers.

South Australian households and businesses may be able to access discounted or free energy efficiency activities from energy retailers participating in the REES. Low-income households may also be able to receive an energy audit.

The Minister has set the approved REES energy efficiency activities; however, each energy retailer participating in the scheme decides on what mix of those energy efficiency activities it will undertake to meet its targets. To find out what activities energy retailers are currently offering, you can contact any of the obliged energy retailers in South Australia, not just the retailer currently supplying you. Energy retailers may contract out their energy audits and energy efficiency activities to third-party contractors, and you may also contact these third-party contractors directly.

Handy Tips for community groups

Justice Connect's Not-for-Profit organisation suggests there are a few tips you can take to find out your organisation's legal structure. If your organisation is a charity, the best place to look is on the ACNC register. Once you have found your organisation's entry, you can check your rules or constitution, which should state the type of legal structure. You can search by name, ABN or CAN.

If your organisation is not a charity, start with the Australian Business Register. You will need the name and ideally the ABN or ACN of your organisation. If your group is a state-based not-for-profit structure such as an incorporated association or a co-operative, it is likely that the ABR will list it as "Other Incorporated Entity". You will then need to search your state / territory regulator of not-for-profits to confirm your structure.
